Item 3:	New Referees Examiner – P Poulin and G Marshall
Matters	Expressions of interest were sought from IWF Level 1 Technical Officials to become the new Referees Examiner and Barbara Grieve has volunteered to take over. S Allan asked G Marshall to list the duties involved in that role. G Marshall suggested the name should be changed to Technical Officials Examiner.
Decision or Recommendations	It was decided that the appointment of the new Referees Examiner be left until after the AGM to ensure the elections results are known and the new EG can make the decision then. P Poulin to inform B Grieve.
Item 4:	OTIP Program 1 Sep-end Oct 2018 – G Marshall
Matters	The OTIP Program runs again this year from 1 st September to end of October. National Secondary School Championships clean and jerks will be entered and Club Managers asked to send in results they want to enter from other OWNZ sanctioned Club competitions. The OWF will pay for one athlete, and have agreed to let a second athlete that is selected to go (OWF to cover food and accommodation) if OWNZ pays for the travel.
Decision or Recommendations	<p>The decision on the two athletes going will be put to the Selectors and the EG will have final approval.</p> <p>N King to verify communications with Paul Coffa after Oceanias.</p> <p>It was moved by R Patterson and seconded by J Dempsey that the \$500USD usually allocated to the Club with the most names to be allocated towards the cost of travel for the second athlete. Item 5:	Ratification of National Records

Decision or Recommendations	Moved by J Dempsey to ratify these records, seconded by G Marshall. Passed unanimously.
Item 6:	Secondary School members voting rights – P Poulin on behalf of parent
Matters	<p>The parent of Secondary School member has concerns that Secondary School members are not allowed to vote for the Executive Group members elections.</p> <p>Email from the parent:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Parent is of the opinion that this is an archaic clause. Secondary School members are highly involved in this sport. Parent also said that if we are trying to encourage youth into our sport to grow, why would we not be giving them rights and responsibilities too. They are asked to bar load.

	<p>They are asked to be drug tested. It seems very double standard. I can understand in some cases you may want guidance from a parent but that's not hard. Why can't the family of the sec school full member get a vote?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Parent thinks it undervalues the kids and is a contradiction to OWNZ's other expectations of them. Parent says the Youth camp was full of Sec School kids who we are trying to grow in the sport who are representing the country yet they have no rights. <p>E-mail responses from Administrator:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Responded that this rule is in the Constitution and explained the procedure needed to submit an amendment to the Constitution (to be submitted by a OWNZ member) that needs to be voted on at the AGM. • Responded that Secondary School members are a very valuable portion of the Olympic Weightlifting community and their contribution is very much appreciated. • Parent still had concerns after that so P Poulin said she would bring up at the next EG meeting and in the meantime if a OWNZ member wants to submit a Constitution amendment that can be done by the deadline (which has passed now) at the same time as the EG itself cannot change the Constitution <p>A discussion ensued that secondary school age persons do not vote for government officials either and that if someone wants to vote and are of age they are welcome to join OWNZ as a member.</p>
Decision or Recommendations	P Poulin to go back to the parent to convey the results of the discussion.
Item 7:	Update on Technical Officials Online and Video Exam – P Poulin
Matters	<p>P Poulin spoke with B Stuart from AWF and had a run through of what he has so far online. Online exams for Club referee and IWF Level 2 and Level 1 have been added on Blackboard, same site as is used for AWF Level 1 Coaching courses. Those exams can be done in class after the Technical Official Workshop and timed, that way students do not have time to research answers online. At the end of the session, the results will be available to know who passed or not, so the Referee Examiner will no longer have to mark exams by hand. B Stuart gave access to Referee Examiner G Marshall for him to look over the site.</p> <p>B Stuart uploaded the Video Exam prototype to the Blackboard site. During the video exam the participant will watch a batch of lifts and have to decide whether they were a good lift or bad lift. Last year's national championships in Dunedin for footage. Recommended to have 2 different video exams of 100 lifts each to be completed over 6 months at the most after the two supervised sessions the Technical Official has already done.</p> <p>The Blackboard system will also allow for Referee Examiner to keep track of which Official has done Marshall or Technical Controller</p>

	duties for example and have a complete picture of an Official individual profile if desired.
Decision or Recommendations	G Marshall suggests the new Referees Examiner, once appointed after the AGM, take over the new exam process.
Item 8:	IWF Masters Champs Recap – N King
Matters	<p>OWNZ had 10 athletes represented in Barcelona. A total of 6 records were broken by two athletes, five medals were obtained and the NZ Women Team finished 8th.</p> <p>The competition had over 900 athletes and was conducted on two platforms.</p> <p>Christian Glinister attended VOE and entered the NZ Team for OWNZ and he and Ianne Guinares coached the majority of our athletes.</p>
Decision or Recommendations	Moved by G Marshall to accept this report, seconded by J Dempsey. Passed unanimously.
Item 9:	Confirmation of Body weight classes for National Masters – P Poulin
Matters	P Poulin requests confirmation of which Body Weight classes will be used for National Masters Championships in December from the EG so entries can be opened.
Decision or Recommendations	Moved by N King to use the current body weight classes, seconded by J Dempsey. Passed unanimously.
Item 10:	National Secondary School Champs Recap – R Patterson
Matters	<p>R Patterson confirmed initial entries were at 106 from 38 different schools. Final number of athletes participating was 94.</p> <p>Winners were:</p> <p>Top U15 Female (Sinclair) - Anja Jennings Top U15 Male - Kitini Taihuka</p> <p>Top 15+ Female Kanah Andrews-Nahu Top 15+ Male - Benet Kumeroa</p> <p>Top Female Team - Epsom Girls Grammar Top Male team - Rangitoto College</p> <p>Total of 20 records between 6 athletes.</p> <p>The Facebook LiveStream attracted 25,297 views totalling 58,000 minutes.</p> <p>His formal report will follow.</p>
Decision or Recommendations	All agreed that the event was an overwhelming success.
Item 11:	Prizegiving – P Poulin
Matters	<p>Ron Mann to provide his suggestions for Outstanding Performance Awards that can be discussed and voted on and P Poulin will provide by e-mail once received. Only two trophies were ordered for that so far.</p> <p>P Poulin confirmed that all EG members at this meeting are going to be at Prizegiving as she is preparing the script for presentations.</p>

	R Patterson mentioned that he ordered new shields for Under 15 Female and Male which will be presented at Nationals.
Decision or Recommendations	Information only, no decision required at this time.
Item 12:	NZ Fitness Expo – P Poulin, S. Allan and R. Patterson
Matters	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● NZ Fitness Expo invitations were sent to Top Sinclair athletes on 20 August. ● Confirmed athletes: 7 Males and a maybe (potential conflict with IWF Senior Worlds) and 13 Females. ● Athletes who declined: 5 Males and 3 Females ● Did not receive response from 3 Male athletes yet so following up. ● NZ Fitness Expo sent more pictures and the Invitation which contains the details of the competition ● R Patterson mentioned he would take the lead in the set up but will need some officials support for the event
Decision or Recommendations	The EG gives carte blanche to R Patterson, S Allan and P Poulin to keep going to fill up the last required spots for this event.
Item 13:	Funding Applications – P Poulin
Matters	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Pelorus Trust application for medals and pins: Due to great increase in entries for National Secondary Schools more medals may need to be ordered with some of the funding that was not yet used. ● Four Winds application for Japan flights: Meeting was 29 August. Declined due to application not being supported by majority of committee. ● Laptop application to Southern Trust: approved for \$1,300 GST exclusive (asked for \$1,500 to include Microsoft Office and Norton). Asking EG to approve purchase of Microsoft Office (quoted as \$79 for one year) and Norton (quoted as \$80 for one year). ● Salary: Infinity Foundation: approved for \$10,000. Will take 4 weeks to process. ● Grassroots Trust (Adm salary) that was put in in June by E Pilkington: meeting on 22 Aug and funding was declined due to no gambling venue in area (Hamilton based) ● NZCT \$6,000 salary from earlier in the year: P Poulin received e-mail notice that reporting was overdue on 23 Aug. During handover, P Poulin was told this had been done online. P Poulin submitted requested paperwork online 24 Aug, but this may negatively influence the salary funding request put in to NZCT (\$10,000) from last EG meeting. Grant accountability was approved on 28 Aug. Current founding application is on 25 Sep meeting agenda and file is complete. ● Funding needs a yearly plan to keep track of different rules, deadlines, number of applications per year. For example, if one application is approved per year and got salary approved, nothing left for airfares from same Trust. A Funding Officer has been recommended by E Pilkington the last few years in the Financial Report and would greatly

	assist in being proactive to seek funds at the right time from the right trusts. Would free up the Administrator for other priorities and for reporting. Solid and timely reporting is crucial to be able to obtain funds again from the same trust.
Decision or Recommendations	Yearly funding plan to be discussed at the EG Yearly Planning session in December. Moved by G Marshall to approve purchase of Microsoft Office (quoted as \$79 for one year) and Norton (quoted as \$80 for one year) to install on the laptop, seconded by J Dempsey. Passed unanimously.
STRATEGIC ITEMS	
Item 14:	Sport NZ meeting and consultation – P Poulin
Matters	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● P Poulin met with Craig McFarlane from Sport NZ. He mentioned that OWNZ has come a long way in the last few years and has seen an increase in number of members. He also said that funding had typically been stable or increased for NSOs but they have now more NSOs so he expects funding to either maintain or decrease. Future funding needs to be connected to their Strategic plan and to solid reporting. Reporting needs to demonstrate quality of events and not just numbers so it is important to continue seeking feedback from participants and demonstrate that solutions to issues brought up are implemented. ● P Poulin attended a Consultation session on participation in sport and the two main issues discussed were how to retain and maintain athletes, and how do we reach those who are missing out. Sport NZ will share the consolidated results from five sessions across the country and P Poulin has attached to agenda e-mail. Sport NZ is revising their strategy and funding needs to be tied in to their strategy so important issues to consider. ● S Kent discussed that Sport NZ has their main targeted sports that they cater to and that OWNZ is doing a fantastic job with very little funding. OWNZ is bringing new athletes into the sport as we saw at the National Secondary Schools . He mentions OWNZ has a massive opportunity to leverage the growth in the sport and to tell our story. ● S Kent and R Patterson have a meeting with HPSNZ at the end of the month about next year’s funding as well.
Decision or Recommendations	Information only, no decision required at this time.
Item 15:	Resignation of Administrator – G Marshall
Matters	P Poulin has put in her resignation letter to the EG effective at the end of the trial period in her contract (29 th September). R Patterson mentions that E Pilkington had given some warnings before and that clearly the scope of the role with the growth of the sport requires more than one paid employee so he is having meetings on potential funding to that effect. J Dempsey suggested a sub-committee be appointed for a quick transition to a new Administrator.
Decision or Recommendations	Sub –Committee will be N King, S Allan and J Dempsey and they will look at options for staffing this role.

Item 16:	IWF Senior Worlds Preliminary entries – S Kent
Matters	<p>The IWF Senior Worlds preliminary entries were due five days after the rules and timings came out. There were 6 EOIs and the last qualifying event is the upcoming 2018 Junior and Senior Nationals Championships. All potential qualifiers are ADAMS compliant.</p> <p>Due to tight timelines and this is a one off, S Kent entered the names into the IWF e-entry system but this is of course pending official selection. If the names were not entered as preliminary entries there is no way to enter anyone as final entries. J Dempsey suggested that Selectors are copied next time as Preliminary entries are put in. Final entries are due on 28 September and no one has been officially selected until the Selectors recommend to the EG who must approve.</p> <p>Sio (Joe) Pomelile was entered under New Zealand at the time because he was in the system as NZ and the IWF had not yet changed him to Tonga. Both Joe and Aisake Tu'itupou were released from OWNZ to Tonga last EG meeting (see Aug EG meeting minutes).</p>
Decision or Recommendations	Keep selectors informed next time preliminary entries are put in.
